Make a Will: Make a Difference this November

Many of us know we should write or update our will but somehow we manage to put it off. Now is the perfect time to take action as, at the same time, you can give a donation to the Will Aid charities and help many thousands of children, families, older people and whole communities in the UK and around the world to build a better life.

Will Aid is the UK's most enduring and successful charity will-making scheme. Throughout November 2011 the scheme offers the chance to have a basic will drawn up by a professional solicitor and give to charity instead of paying the solicitor's usual fee. The suggested donation is £85 for a single Will, £125 for mirror Wills or £40 for a codicil or change to a previous will. There are more than 1,300 generous solicitors all over the UK waiting to take your appointment. You can find someone local to you at www.willaid.org.uk or by phoning 0300 0300 013.

Their website also has a good deal of information on wills and inheritance issues as well as a useful will planner to help prepare your will. Make a will and make a real difference today. By giving generously to reflect the solicitor's time and expertise, you can help us beat last year's fantastic total of over £1.5 million raised for the Will Aid charities.

Will Aid is an annual fundraising campaign involving nine of the UK's leading charities: ActionAid, British Red Cross, Christian Aid, Age UK, NSPCC, Save the Children, Sightsavers, SCIAF (Scotland) and Trocaire (N. Ireland). The money raised is shared by the participating charities.

PEOPLE SHOULDN'T BE BOUGHT & SOLD Global Initiative to Fight Human Trafficking

***Didn't get tickets for the Olympics?
This is your opportunity to take part!***

Stop the Traffik are looking for volunteers and communities to take part in a project to raise awareness about human trafficking. GIFT box is a giant box that looks like a present. Promises of exciting opportunities entice people to the box, however once inside it's a different story. The stark reality of human trafficking is revealed. We need your help to ensure the GIFT box installations are in the right places throughout London during the games, and are staffed to engage as many people as possible. We want people to know what human trafficking is and what they can do about it.

There are 3 ways to get involved:

Host a GIFT box: we are looking for venues to host a GIFT box. We would love to hear from you whether you are a church, a school, a company, or you know somebody who has a piece of land in a strategic location suitable for a GIFT box. We want the boxes to be able to be seen from a distance, be accessible by foot and within easy distance of a transport hub.

Become a GIFT box Olympics Volunteer: we need volunteers at every GIFT box during the Olympics to engage others in what they can do to prevent human trafficking. You can volunteer with a group such as your friends, community group or work colleagues, or you can get involved as an individual.

Sponsor a GIFT box: over half of the boxes have already been sponsored. If you would like to sponsor one, some, or all of the remaining boxes, please get in touch as soon as possible to avoid disappointment. Applications will be reviewed in the order they are received.

The Autumn Assembly hosted the book launch of *The Catholic Social Conscience: Reflections On Thought And Action*, a collection of writings edited by Francis Davis and Keith Chappell. There are chapters written by the editors as well as by Erik Borgman (Tilburg), Ellen Van Stichel (Leuven) and Gerald Grace (London) not to mention survivors of Soviet persecution and those at the coalface of charity leadership and community activism. It is the sort of thing that will appeal to academics in theology and religious studies who want to inspire their students and undergraduates, to charity leaders looking for new ideas and those in parishes who want something more than a bland reassurance that 'Catholic social teaching is the Church's best kept secret'.
